Dr Stephen Battersby is an Independent Environmental Health and Housing Consultant of more than 20 years standing. He is also Senior Visiting Research Fellow of the Robens Centre for Public and Environmental Health at the University of Surrey as well as an Associate of ERRG in the School of Law. His research interest at the Robens Centre is public health and rodent infestations and he was the lead author of the 2008 WHO publication on the "Public Health Implications of Urban Pests". He is also an Associate of the WHO Collaborating Centre for Housing Standards and Health at Warwick University. At Warwick he was part of the team that developed the Housing Health and Safety Rating System for the Government. He was also instrumental in developing the training package on the HHSRS delivered to officers of all local housing authorities prior to the implementation of the HHSRS under the Housing Act 2004. Other housing -related research includes on housing conditions, legal rights and responsibilities, local housing authority enforcement activity and on urban renewal.



He is a visiting lecturer at Kings College, London University, where he teaches the housing module for the MSC Environmental Health.

He was elected President of the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH) for a three year period 2008-2010, and also chairs the CIEH National Pest Advisory Panel. He is the new editor of Clay's Handbook of Environmental Health with the 20th Edition due for publication in 2010."
