Michael Mehling is a Fellow with Ecologic – Institute of International and European Environmental Policy, Berlin, and a Research Associate at the Faculty of Law and Economics, University of Greifswald. In his work, he



addresses various issues of environmental law and policy, and his doctoral dissertation focuses on the choice and interplay of regulatory instruments for climate and energy policy. Previously, he worked as a researcher and lecturer at the Universities of Helsinki, Konstanz, and the Zeppelin University, Friedrichshafen. As a policy consultant, he has participated in research and advisory projects on environmental and energy policy for government agencies in the United States, Germany, Finland, China, Thailand, and Vietnam, as well as the European Commission. He also regularly advises private firms on the implementation of corporate environmental management strategies.

Michael Mehling has published nearly fifty articles and book chapters in four languages, including contributions to the *European Journal of International Law*, the *Yearbook of International Environmental Law*, the *European Environmental Law Review* and *Sustainable Development Law & Policy*, and authors the Current Survey on Energy & Environment for the *Yearbook of European Environmental Law* at the Oxford University Press. He currently serves as the Editor of the *Carbon & Climate Law Review* and the Executive Editor of the *Journal for European Environmental & Planning Law*, and has also been an editor of the *Finnish Yearbook of International Law*. Lately, he has been a reviewer for *Climate Policy*, *International Environmental*

He has been awarded a number of grants and scholarships, including a John J. McCloy Fellowship in Environmental Affairs of the American Council on Germany and a three-year research grant by the Finnish Academy, and is a member of the Gesellschaft für Umweltrecht and the Verein für Umweltrecht, a Charter Member of the Environmental Law Network International, as well as an honorary fellow of the Center for International Legal Studies. For the European Environmental Law News Service of the T.M.C. Asser Institute in The Hague, he covers developments in environmental law as a National Correspondent for Germany. At the University of Greifswald, he helped establish and organizes the international Summer Academy “Energy and the Environment”, which has been held since 2004 in Greifswald and at alternating foreign locations, including the State University of Irkutsk and the Central European University, Budapest.

Michael Mehling graduated from the Faculty of Law at the University of Konstanz, and obtained an LL.M. diploma in international law from the University of Helsinki. His thesis on “The Concept of Effectiveness in International Environmental Law” was supervised by Professor Martti Koskenniemi and approved *eximia cum laude*. During his judicial training, he was an articulated clerk with the department of environmental crimes at the Office of the Public Prosecutor, the District Court and the Administrative Court of the Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg, and interned with the German Emissions Trading Authority (DEHSt) in Berlin and the Brazilian environmental consultancy, Âmbito – Homem e Ambiente, Belo Horizonte. He is admitted to the German bar. Michael Mehling is a German and United States citizen and has also lived extended periods of time in Chile (7 years), Finland (4 years) and Brazil (3 months). A native speaker of German and English, he is also fluent in Spanish, has good command of French and Portuguese, and knows basic Finnish.
